What is the Ko'olau 'Ohana Festival?

The 'Ohana Festival is KEY Project's major annual fundraising event, assisting our 501(c)(3) non-profit agency with critical *unrestricted* funds. Your support ensures that the community center is well-managed and fully able to support the many programs and services that KEY offers to the community from Kane'ohe to Kahuku (northern Ko'olau). The gathering is also an opportunity for us to share some of our programs, and to provide a venue for our local farmers and vendors to showcase their goods and services. It is also an opportunity for us to acknowledge the vibrancy of our windward community!

When, where, and what time is the event?

On Saturday, October 21, 2017, the event begins at 5:00pm with pupu's, live music and our popular silent auction and plant sale. Dinner is served at 6:00pm followed by a formal program. The event takes place at KEY Project's multi-purpose center on the windward side: **47-200 Waihe'e Road, Kane'ohe, HI 96744**. Free parking is available along Waihe'e Road and adjacent to Kahalu'u Regional Park (ADA accessible).

What is the cost to attend the Ko'olau 'Ohana Festival?

Each table seating eight (8) guests is at a cost of **\$1,700.00**. Although we will not be selling individual tickets, individuals are welcome to 'ohana-up to fill a table of eight – or we are more than happy to coordinate with other interested individuals for a shared table! We expect tables to sell fast, so please reserve your table as soon as possible.

What is KEY Project?

We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization (FEIN No. 990118209) that provides a wide array of programs and services for youth and families of the northern Ko'olaupoko and Ko'olaupoko communities. Our focus is on prevention and transitional support, including positive learning options for our youth such as tutorial help and recreational activities during critical summer months, intercessions and evening hours. We also house programs from other community service providers who align with our mission, including early childhood assistance, meals and social activities for seniors, alternative education options and food distribution for those in need. KEY's office is open from 8:00am to 4:30pm daily, but the facility is open till 10:00pm as a safe meeting site and vibrant hub for activities in the community.
